# CONTINUED GROWTH OF IB SCHOOLS AUSTRALASIA

Our Association continues to grow and develop.

While our membership numbers remained steady with 121 full member schools and 12 Associate member schools in 2018-2019 (as compared to 119 full member schools and 14 Associate member schools in 2017-2018) our services expanded significantly to include an additional Speaker Series event, a Student Speaker Series event for PYP Students, additional streams of communication with our letters to networks and Employment Opportunities Bulletin, continued growth of our Employment services and certificates for member schools.

In March 2019, The IB Schools Australasia Strategic Plan 2019-2021 was released at the IB Global Conference in Hong Kong. The Strategic Plan outlines our objectives and activities, including our first biannual Leadership Symposium in August 2019 and Conference in September 2020.

We look forward to the continued growth and development of our association and support for member schools.

#### STUDENT SPEAKER SERIES

2018 saw the continuation of the Student Speaker Series presented by Dr John Willison, School of Education, The University of Adelaide with Student Speaker Series events for both PYP and MYP students.

In 2018 there were 6 Student Speaker Series events organised for our member schools.

### **EMPLOYMENT SERVICES**

Throughout the 2018 - 2019 financial year our very popular employment services have continued to grow. IB Schools Australasia recognises that our Member Schools are employers of choice, therefore, to assist schools with sourcing the best candidates for positions, IB Schools Australasia continued to provide advertising on our website, in our weekly bulletin and on our Facebook page and LinkedIn page free of charge to our member schools.

In mid-February, 2018 the careers page was launched at <a href="https://ibaustralasia.org/careers">https://ibaustralasia.org/careers</a>
The careers page has increased our reach to potential candidates outside of our database. During the 2018-2019 financial year we advertised 296 positions within our member schools on our website, in the weekly bulletin and on our Facebook and LinkedIn pages.

### IB SCHOOLS AUSTRALASIA CERTIFICATES FOR STUDENTS

In 2018-2019, the IB Schools Australasia Certificates were expanded to include certificates for the  ${\sf CP}.$ 

Orders were facilitated through the inclusion of order forms in the IB Schools Australasia newsletter, distributed towards the end of the school year.

The following range of Certificates were available to member schools:

### Career-related Programme

Certificate of Merit for CP graduates who have achieved 6+ (only 2 taken)

- Certificate of Merit for the Reflective Project for CP graduates who have achieved a B or above
- Certificate of Outstanding Career Related Studies for CP graduates who have achieved the highest level in their chosen professional course
- Certificate of outstanding Service. This Certificate is to be presented within schools as they see fit for a small number of students whose service embodies the IB mission statement ideal. It is anticipated that there would be only one of two of these awarded in any one school.
- Career Programme Achievement. This Certificate is for CP graduates who have completed the requirements of the Career-related programme. This certificate could be used by schools or Networks that have ceremonies where all students who pass the Career-related programme are recognised.

## Diploma Programme

- Certificate of Distinction for DP graduates who have achieved an IB score of 40 points or more.
- Certificate of Merit for DP graduates who have achieved at least one Grade 7 in one subject or an 'A' in EE/TOK.
- Certificate of outstanding Creativity, Action and Service. This Certificate is to be presented within schools as they see fit for a small number of students whose CAS embodies the IB mission statement ideal. It is anticipated that there would be only one of two of these awarded in any one school.
- Diploma Achievement. This Certificate is for DP graduates who have completed the requirements of the Diploma. This certificate could be used by schools or Networks that have ceremonies where all students who pass the Diploma are recognised.

# Middle Years Programme

- Certificate of Distinction are for students who have achieved an overall average score greater than 6 across all subjects.
- Certificate of Merit for students who have achieved a score of 7 in one or more subjects.
- Certificate of outstanding Service as Action. This certificate is to be presented within schools as they see fit to a small number of students whose Service as Action embodies the IB mission statement ideal. It is anticipated that there would be only one of two of these awarded in any one school
- Certificate of Participation. This Certificate is for students who have participated in the Middle Years Programme and been involved in the Personal Project or the Community Project in their final year (Please select the relevant option). This certificate could be used in schools which are moderated as well as those that are not.

### **Primary Years Programme**

• Certificate of Participation for students who have participated in the Primary Years Programme and have been involved in the Exhibition in the final year.

## ADVOCATING FOR OUR MEMBER SCHOOLS

During 2018 – 2019 IB Schools Australasia has advocated in the areas of Diploma Programme results release dates and the introduction of Te Reo *ab initio* for the Diploma Programme.

Whilst there were not sufficient numbers of students to add Te Reo ab initio for the Diploma Programme at present, the IB will continue to work with us in this area if the projected numbers of students increase.

IB Schools Australasia was delighted to be informed that, following our ongoing discussions and submission to the International Baccalaureate, that the Diploma Programme (DP) and Career-related Programme (CP) exam results for the November 2020 session will be released on a new date.

For the November 2020 DP and CP examination session, the IB will release results to schools on 17 December 2020.

We would sincerely like to thank all those schools involved and the IB for making this new results release date possible.

## COMMUNICATION AND INVOLVEMENT OF OUR MEMBER SCHOOLS

A regular Newsletter was sent electronically to Heads, Coordinators and other interested staff members at member schools in 2018 - 2019. These have outlined the details of the Speaker Series, Student Speaker Series, IB workshops, marketing opportunities including the website and administrative matters relating to the Association and the Annual General Meeting.

Due to the development of the employment services IB Schools Australasia has also developed a separate database for the weekly employment bulletin. The current subscription to this database is over 730 contacts.

In 2018, IB Schools Australasia also commenced with the provision of a letter to the networks within our region each term to provide them with an update on our services and news from the IB and from other Australasian networks. This information has been very well received and will continue to be provided to networks on an ongoing basis.

## STRATEGIC DIRECTIONS

The Standing Committee continues to be committed to providing services to meet the needs of member schools and has commenced exploring other services which might be offered. This has continued to be a major focus of meetings held in 2018 and early 2019.

As IB Schools Australasia looks to the coming years, we are hoping to provide more professional learning opportunities within Australasia both as workshops and conferences.

We look forward to working with our member schools over the 2019-2020 year.
